Offense: Burglary of a Vehicle

An officer received a call via city cell phone from local resident. The resident needed to report a burglary of a vehicle that occurred on the night of 2-3-17 around 2300 hours, at her residence. The officer arrived and made contact with the resident who was reviewing the surveillance footage of the incident. The resident stated that the unknown subject went into her SUV through the front passenger door and took a blue backpack and a pair of black female sunglasses without her permission. The resident said that the total value of the stolen items was \$350.00. This case is under investigation.

An officer received a phone call in reference to a theft that had just occurred. The officer went to the business and contacted the manager who reported a male walked into the store and walked straight to the gun display where an accordion was being displayed for sale. The unknown male grabbed the accordion and proceeded to walk out of the store without paying for it. The manager stated that he followed the male subject out of the store in an attempt to get some sort of identification of the male subject. The manager was able to obtain a license plate to a silver 4

door Pontiac Grand AM. The officer did a computerized check on the license plate to identify the owner. The manager ran that name through the store database but came up with nothing. The officer reviewed the surveillance footage of the incident and it showed the male subject place the accordion in the back seat and leave the premises. This case is under investigation.

A resident reported his vehicle being broken into overnight. The resident showed the officer a surveillance video taken at his residence which recorded the following. Officers immediately noticed a large group of men sitting together on the patio area. Officers approached the group and asked for the subject by name. They all looked surprised as they looked at each other. The group willingly showed their identification. The wanted person was in that group. The male was walked outside and arrested. The male was then booked into jail.
