Offense: Burglary of a Building

Location: 15300 blk San Pedro

A business employee called to report a burglary. Behind the business is a detached, locked, storage shed. Inside the storage shed the employee keeps various tools and materials he is using to remodel the business. According to the employee, he last saw the storage shed locked and secure around 1800 hours on 02/19/2017. He arrived at work on 02/20/2017 around 0800 and noticed the locking mechanism and lock had been pried away from the wood door frame. As the employee looked inside the storage shed, he noticed an unknown person(s) had removed his Orange Rigid nail gun, his Porter Cable pancake air compressor, and a Craftsman tool box containing a socket set and miscellaneous other tools. All items taken had a loss value of \$650 according to the employee. The employee stated he did have some contractors at the office last week, but did not know if they were responsible for the burglary. The employee had picked up and moved the old locking mechanism from the storage shed and replaced it with a heavy duty locking mechanism prior to my arrival. The employee had also spoke to the neighboring business owner asked him to review his cameras to see if they recorded anyone driving into the business parking lot. This case is under investigation.

A resident called the patrol cell phone to report a suspicious male walking in the area with a back pack. The resident did not have any further information other than he waved at her when she

drove by and he was walking towards the 200 block of Limestone Creek. The officer responded to the area to look for the male. The officer did not observe anyone in the area. As the officer made a second pass, he observed the male walking on the side of the road. The officer made contact with the male who said he was just walking and taking photos. The officer asked the male if he was selling anything and he said no, but he had sold magazine subscriptions in the past. The officer obtained the male's identification and checked him for wants and warrants. He was clear. The officer advised him that the city had a no solicitation ordinance so he should not contact the residents to try and sell them items. The male departed the location on foot towards Tower Drive. The individuals helped the officer push the vehicle out of the entrance way and into a parking spot. The driver contact road side assistance, who was on the way to the location. The elderly woman was then escorted inside the store to wait inside and out of the sun. The driver did not need further assistance from the officer. The officer resumed patrol.
