## **Calls of Interest**

### **Offense: Suspicious Person**

**Date: 02.26.17**

**Time: 0730 hours**

**Location: 100 blk Blackhawk Trail**

An officer was dispatched to above location for two females wearing sports bras and bike shorts being photographed on the side of the road. The refused complainant stated that this was very unusual activity for a Sunday morning. The officer arrived and found the two described females and several others in front of a home on Blackhawk Trail. When asked what they were doing, they explained they were photography students completing an assignment for school. They were left to continue with their assignment.

An officer initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle due to his observation of the vehicle braking suddenly and driving erratically. The officer did not detect any odor of alcohol, and therefore did not suspect him of driving while intoxicated. The driver did seem to be on some sort of drugs. A computer check showed the driver to be wanted for questioning by SAPD for recent thefts in San Antonio. The computer check also showed the driver to have 5 active warrants. The driver was arrested and his car was impounded. The driver was then booked on the warrants. SAPD was notified that he was being taken to the jail.
