An officer was dispatched to assist Hollywood Park with a suspicious person call. The dispatch showed there to be a male wearing black that had stopped and knocked on the door of a residence. While checking the area with HPPD, officers located a male matching the description provided by the homeowner and approached him. Officers found the male to be heavily intoxicated and unsure of his location and surroundings. The male stated that he was in the military and was out drinking with his friends. The male did not appear to know anything else about his night or how he got to Hollywood Park. The male stated multiple times that he believed he was in Leon Valley. Officers allowed the male to call a friend to pick him up and then transported the male to the HPPD building at 2 Mecca drive where he would be held until his ride arrived. The HCV officer resumed patrol.

An officer was dispatched to a local restaurant in reference to a child that had been left by her parents in the parking lot. When the officer arrived at the location, the officer found the child to be in the care of an adult male. The male stated that he found the child in her car seat, on the sidewalk adjacent to the parking lot of the business. The child was found unattended. The manager of the business approached the officer and stated that the parents who had left the child called the business and stated they were on their way back to retrieve the child. The child's father arrived at the business with his wife and other children and retrieved the child. The officer interviewed the father in order to ascertain what led to him and his wife leaving the child at the business. The father stated that the family consisted of five (5) children and that the oldest was "left in charge" of the youngest. Another child had run away from the parents while they were packing everything up and the parents became distracted and did not notice the youngest child had not been placed into their vehicle. During the interview, the officer was given the impression that the parents were responsible and appropriately distraught at the situation, indicating there was no neglect or mal intent in the incident. The child was released to the parents without incident.
