## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: EMS Call**

**Date: 03.14.17**

**Time: 1642 hours**

**Location: 500 blk West Bitters Road**

An officer was dispatched to a restaurant in reference to an injured adult at the location. The dispatch showed there to be an adult female with a laceration to her armpit area. Dispatchers notified the officer that San Antonio Fire Department was activated and dispatched as well. When the officer arrived at the location, he found a female to be on the floor and several bystanders attempting to calm her as she was experiencing what appeared to be a panic attack. The officer applied a pressure bandage to the wound on the female's upper right arm. The officer did not see the injury directly, but held pressure with the bandage until EMS personnel arrived. SAFD arrived at the location and took over care of the female. The female was transported to the hospital for the work injury.

**Offense: Information**

**Date: 03.16.17**

**Time: 1200 hours**

**Location: 15200 blk San Pedro**

An officer was approached by a male while on patrol. The male was canvassing the businesses of Hill Country Village in an effort to recover his lost pet. The male stated that he was unsure whether or not he wanted to make a report as he was unsure whether his pet had been stolen. The officer arrived at the store where the male works. The male provided surveillance video that showed a white, late model Ford pickup drive to the area where the pet was last seen and then leave the area. No one can be seen exiting the vehicle or directly handling the pet in the provided video. The male stated that he believes the owner of the truck must have thought that

his pet was a stray dog and took him. The pet is outfitted with a microchip information chip under the skin. HCVPD officers were notified of the description of the vehicle and missing pet.

**Offense: Possession of Drug Paraphernalia**

**Date: 03.17.17**

**Time: 0200 hours**

**Location: 500 blk West Bitters Road**

While parked in the 500 Blk. of W. Bitters Road, an officer observed a vehicle traveling westbound at a high rate of speed. The officer clocked the vehicle traveling 53mph in a clearly marked 40mph zone. The officer initiated his emergency lights and conducted a traffic stop. The officer made contact with the driver and informed him why he was conducting the traffic stop (due to violation of posted speed limit). There were four (4) other female passengers in the vehicle. The officer detected the odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. A computer check was done on the driver and the return came back clear. The officer asked occupants to step out of the vehicle, which they did. The driver informed the officer that he smokes marijuana and that one of the back passengers brought some so all the individuals could smoke in the car. While looking in the vehicle, the officer observed marijuana residue in plain view on the floorboard. While conducting the search, the officer discovered a multicolored glass pipe in the center console (commonly used to smoke marijuana) and a blue container on the front passenger floorboard with marijuana residue inside of it. Both Items were seized as evidence and later placed in Hill Country Village Evidence Room for safe keeping. The driver informed the officer that he and other friends (that were not currently in the vehicle) had smoked marijuana a few hours prior to the incident. The driver was cited for the speeding and drug paraphernalia. One of the occupants that had not smoked marijuana drove the vehicle from the scene.
