## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Theft**

**Date: 04.04.17**

**Time: 1730 hours**

**Location: 15800 blk San Pedro**

An officer received a call for a theft at a local restaurant. The officer arrived and made contact with the male complainant. The male reported that around 1730 hours, he arrived at the restaurant to meet his family for a quick bite. Around 1800 hours, the male was leaving the restaurant and noticed that his tailgate to his black 2013 Ford F-250 was missing. The male stated that the tailgate was on the truck prior to entering the restaurant. Also stolen was a yellow DeWalt cordless drill set. The male provided an estimated value for the tailgate of \$1500. The male was unable to provide an estimated value for the DeWalt drill. Suspects are unknown and this case is under investigation.

The officer reviewed the dash camera for that stop and observed the signs to have no bullet holes. The signs sustained the damaged between the hours of 1900 of 3-31-2017 and 1000 hours of 04-06-17.

The officer stood by observing the male subject as he walked towards the US 281 access road. The subject did not show lack of judgement while crossing the street. No further action was taken and the officer resumed patrol.
