Offense: Suspicious Person

A storage manager called the city cell to report a suspicious male lying under her bedroom window. The manager said she had just arrived at the business when she got out of her truck and saw the male. She asked the male if he needed anything. The male told her that he had permission to sleep there. Officers arrived and contacted the male. It was obvious that he was homeless. Officers identified the male and did a computer check which came back clear. Officers told the male that he would have to leave the property. The male complied and began to walk southbound on the access road. Officers resumed patrol.

Officers were dispatched to a medical business for a disturbance in progress. The dispatcher said that a female was outside with a male who had just hit her. After hitting her, the male had departed the location on a motorcycle. An officer made contact with the victim in the upstairs office of the business. The female was sobbing and visibly upset. The officer asked her what had happened and she told the officer that her ex-husband had come to the office and began to cause a scene. Not wanting her ex to scare the patients, she asked him to step out into the parking lot to talk. Once outside the male began to get angry at his ex-wife. She said he made statements that he wanted to kill her, and it was all he could do not to bash her face in. The female began to fear for her safety at this point. She was wearing a two way radio connected to the office staff. She reached for her ear piece cord to call for help. At that time, the ex-husband

shoved her into a parked car. Once she hit the car, the male reached out and grabbed the radio cord, ripped it off of her, threw it on the ground and broke it. While doing this, the male also ripped her scrub shirt. The female also sustained red blotches to the left side of her neck/throat. Once the male broke the radio cord, he got on his motorcycle and departed the location. The female was very concerned for her and her son's safety. The male is an active member of a motor cycle club. According to the female, her ex has been leaving her threatening e-mails and text messages. She spoke to the motor cycle club president regarding the behavior, which she states is why the male came to her work today in such a rage. The female further stated that her ex was a military contractor and with this arrest, he may be terminated. She is scared that he will now have nothing to lose and come after her and her son. The female also stated that upon her divorce from her ex, her divorce attorney filled for a restraining order against the male. At the time of the filling of this report, the officer was not able to verify an active restraining order. A description of the male and the motorcycle was put out over the radio. Within minutes, the male was stopped by Hollywood Park Police. The male was arrested for the assault and taken to jail on several charges. He had several weapons in his possession when he was stopped.

An officer stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation. The officer contacted the driver and explained why he was stopped and requested his license and insurance. The male stated he did not have his license or insurance with him at the time. He provided the officer with a US Passport for identification. A computer check showed the male to have four (4) active warrants for his arrest out of the San Antonio Municipal Court. The return also showed the male's license was expired as of 11/06/2016.
