Offense: Burglary of a Vehicle

An officer was dispatched to a business for a reported vehicle burglary. Details of the call simply indicated the burglary happened to an employee's vehicle sometime today. Upon arrival, contact was made with the male caller who said he arrived for work at 0930 this morning and parked behind the business, along the fence where all employees are instructed to park. The male said he came out back to conduct a test ride on a customer's bike and noticed the tail gate to his truck to be in the down position. The male said the truck has a bed cover on it as well, and for the tail gate to be down is unusual. He looked in the bed of his truck and noticed items to be missing. All the items missing had been located within the bed of the truck. Numerous high value items were left behind but he believed the reported missing items were the only items taken without his consent. The items stolen were tools. This case is under investigation.

An officer stopped a car for speeding on West Bitters Road. The vehicle came to a stop in the 14100 block of Bluff Manor just south of West Bitter Road. The officer exited his police unit and made contact with the male driver. The officer requested to see his driver's license and proof of insurance. The driver only provided his driver's license and said he did not have the insurance on his person, but that he was insured. A computer check showed the driver to have active warrants. The driver was arrested and placed the patrol car. During the inventory of his vehicle, the officer located a small black bag in the driver's side door pocket which contained used drug paraphernalia. The officer also located an altered shotgun. It appeared to have been sawed off at the end of the barrel and filed down to a not very smooth edge. The shotgun was loaded with 5 live heavy caliber rounds in the chamber. The officer located the shotgun tucked between the driver side seat and center console. Both items were seized and tagged into evidence at the Hill Country Village Police Department. The vehicle was then impounded. The driver was charged with possession of a prohibited weapon and cited for possession of drug paraphernalia and speeding. The driver was booked into jail.
