Offense: Information Report – Shots Fired

Date: 05.28.2017

Time: 0220 hours

Location: 13800 blk San Pedro

While on patrol an officer observed two vehicles, one white two door car and one gray four door car, travelling in the 13800 blk of San Pedro heading southbound on the access road. The Officer heard several gunshots and was able to see a muzzle flash coming from the white car. The officer initiated a pursuit of the white car; however, lost sight of the vehicle after entering the highway. Officers coordinated with the Bexar County Sheriff's Office and informed them of the vehicle description. At the scene of the shooting, six shell casings were recovered as evidence. No arrests have been made as of yet.

Offense: Bomb Threat Hoax

Date: 05.30.17

Time: 1029 hours

Location: 500 blk West Bitters Road

An officer was conducting traffic enforcement in the 500 block of West Bitters Road and was approached by two females from a local business. They stated that they received a fax stating that explosives had been placed in the building. The females told the officer that they found the note on their printer. The officer immediately contacted dispatch and requested additional units to respond to the location and help evacuate the area. Other officers secured the entrances to the business. Bexar County Sheriff's Office bomb detecting dogs were called to the scene and found no evidence of explosives. Once the area was declared safe for entry, an officer took three pictures of the location where the note was found. The pictures were uploaded to the Hill Country Village Police Department server. The note was collected as evidence. It was later

learned through law enforcement channels that the fax was a part of hoax that was perpetrated on a national level in the U.S.

Offense: Violation of a Protective Order

Date: 06.02.2017

Time: 0240 hours

Location: 13800 blk San Pedro

While on patrol, an officer encountered a vehicle parked at a local business in the 13800 Blk of San Pedro. Due to the fact that the business was closed and had experienced recent burglaries, the officer decided to contact the two people inside the vehicle. After a check of the identifications belonging to the two people, it was discovered by officers that one person had a protective order against the other. The person who was in violation of the protective order was placed under arrest and the other was released. An inventory of the vehicle was conducted and resulted in the recovery of a small amount of marijuana and drug paraphernalia, which was seized for destruction and placed in the police evidence room.
