## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Theft**

**Date: 10.30.16**

**Time: 1600 hours**

**Location: 13800 blk San Pedro**

An officer received a call on the city cell phone from the manager of a pawn shop. The manager wanted to report a theft. The officer went to the location and met with the manager. The manager stated that two older males entered the store and stole a magnetic locator from the tool room. While reviewing surveillance camera footage due to the presence of another suspicious person in the store, the manager observed the two male actors concealing and leaving with the stolen item. None of the store employees directly witnessed the action. The manager provided video surveillance footage from the store's system in which the subjects can be seen clearly concealing and leaving with the property. The two males appear to be in their late 40's. This case is under investigation.

**Offense: Information**

**Location: 15800 blk San Pedro**

An officer was dispatched to a local restaurant a suspicious person. The officer arrived and met with the caller who stated that a tan in color Toyota Camry drove up to him in the parking lot of the business and the male in the car asked the caller if he had any money. When caller replied that he did not carry cash, the subject suggested that they go to an ATM machine to withdraw

money for him. The caller stated that at no time was the male threatening him nor acting aggressively, however the caller told the subject that he was "not going anywhere" and that the subject "had better leave now". The caller stated that his father is the owner of a large business and that they had, on multiple occasions, encountered this same male attempting to get money from people at their business. The caller stated that he knew the subject well and that the subject had also been featured on the local news as a known "con-artist". The caller wished to make a report to document the incident and make the HCVPD aware that this subject now seemed to be operating within the confines of Hill Country Village. A license plate check of the plate number provided by the caller returned to a vehicle that matched the description given by the caller. The registration showed that the vehicle owner is registered as a sex offender and has had several contacts with law enforcement, particularly the San Antonio Police Department. There was no evidence of a criminal offense being committed at that time and no further action was taken on the matter.

**Offense: Missing Person**

**Date: 11.05.16**

**Time: 1007 hours**

**Location: 400 blk Winding Way**

An officer was dispatched to the 400 Block of Winding Way for a male sitting in the roadway. As the officer approached the location she observed a male walking northbound on Winding Way. The officer made contact with the male and identified him. The officer spoke with the male and asked if he was okay and he stated he was fine. The officer noticed his right hand was bloody and asked him what had happen. The male gave several versions of what had happened to his hand with none of them making any sense. A computer check showed the male to be Missing/Endangered out of the City of San Antonio. The officer placed the male in handcuffs and placed him in the rear of the patrol vehicle. The officer made contact with SAPD Missing Persons Division and they confirmed he had been court ordered to the San Antonio State Hospital and that he was missing from that location. The male was transported to the State Hospital and released into their custody.
