A store manager called police to make a theft report. An officer met with the manager who reported that an unknown male had taken a valuable flute from the store. The flute was recently purchased by the business and was being kept near the firearms section of the store. While reviewing pricing on items in the firearms area, the manager stated that he left the flute on top of the glass counter to his right and accessible to customers. According to the manager, the value of the item was clearly printed on the label that was attached to the case. The manager provided surveillance camera footage that showed an unidentified male enter the business at approximately 10:40am. The actor can then be seen looking around the business then picking up the listed item and walking around the store with it. The camera footage clearly shows the actor conceal the item in his pants and then leave the store with the item at approximately 10:47am. The actor appears to be a male approximately 25-30 years of age. An approximate height could not be established. The actor was wearing a dark colored t-shirt and pants and a grey hoodie sweater; a black baseball hat with the words "San Antonio" printed in white on it and a gold chain with gold cross pendant. The actor's eyes were not visible in camera footage, but he did appear to have a goatee style beard. The manager said the male appeared to be a person who has been to the business prior to this incident, though he was unsure as to when. The actor was seen, in camera footage, driving a silver in color, late model Pontiac 4-door sedan. The license plate was unreadable due to the quality of the camera footage. This case is under investigation.
