Offense: Theft

Date: 11.14.16

Time: 1247 hours

Location: 15600 blk San Pedro

An officer received a phone call via city cell phone from a local store manager in reference to a theft that occurred on 11-12-16. The officer went to the location and contacted the manager. The manager reported that during a routine status check of the camera system, he noticed that two cameras were off. The manager verified by going outside and seeing that the cameras were gone. The manager reviewed the surveillance footage from the weekend and he observed a male individual walking from the Country Village Shopping area and approach the wash bay area and grab some empty buckets. The male individual then took the number 9 and the number 6 cameras from the building. The male individual used the empty buckets to stand on in order to remove the cameras. The individual was described as a male around 5'7", wearing a yellow jacket and khaki in color pants. The manager stated that the cameras were attached and secured to the southwest corners at the rear of the building. The cameras were valued at \$300. This case is under investigation.

Offense: Wanted Person

An officer was approached by a female in the parking lot of a restaurant. The female was crying and stated that she needed help getting back to her hotel but did not know where it was located or

the name of the hotel. The female further stated that she had been in a verbal argument with a male friend who had rented the hotel room and that she decided to walk to the hotel from Loop 1604 and US Hwy 281. The officer took her to City Hall so a computer search could be done of local hotels. A police computer check of the female showed her to have two Bexar County warrants. The female was arrested and booked into jail.

An officer was dispatched for a residential alarm. The officer arrived and made contact with the home owner who informed the officer that a possible burglary of his home had occurred. The owner showed the officer the back porch where a flower pot was used to hold open the exterior screen door. There were signs of forced entry to the door. Officers gathered evidence at the residence. This case is under investigation.

Offense: Possession of Marijuana

An officer stopped a vehicle for a defective headlamp. The officer contacted the driver and passenger. While at the driver's window, the officer detected a strong odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle and observed a green leafy substance on the driver's pants and throughout the vehicle. The officer asked the driver if he had any marijuana or illegal items in the vehicle. The driver began to get nervous and informed the officer that he and his passenger just finished smoking earlier but did not have any marijuana on their persons. The officer conducted a search of the vehicle and discovered a green leafy substance (Marijuana) in a white plastic bag under the passenger side seat. The officer also discovered three black digital scales and two boxes of clear plastic baggies. The driver was informed of his (Miranda) rights, which he stated he understood. The officer asked the driver about the marijuana that was discovered in his vehicle. The driver informed the officer that the marijuana in the white plastic bag under the passenger seat belonged to him and not his passenger. The driver was then informed that he was under arrest. The passenger and vehicle were released. The driver was booked into jail.
