## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Suspicious Person**

**Location: 14000 blk San Pedro**

An officer observed an individual walking southbound in the 14000 Blk. of San Pedro Ave. The individual was using a flashlight to look into businesses while he was walking by them. The officer initiated contact with the male and asked him what he was doing. The male informed the officer that he got kicked out of his house by his wife and was going to find a place to sleep for the night. The male stated he was using his flashlight to look for cigarettes on the ground. The officer asked the male for identification and the male stated he has traffic warrants and maybe a warrant out of Rockport, TX. For safety and investigational purposes, the male was detained and placed handcuffs. Before conducting a pat down search on the male he informed the officer that he had two knives and a capped needle. A computer check showed the male did not have warrants. The needle was destroyed and the male was released.

A citizen contacted an officer wanting to report a possible lost or stolen wallet that occurred in the parking lot of a local business. Upon leaving the premises he noticed that he did not have his wallet on his person. A pawn shop employee assisted the male in

reviewing the surveillance footage for that day. The employee confirmed that the male accidentally dropped his wallet in the parking lot of the pawn shop and another male picked up the wallet and left the premises with the wallet. The surveillance footage showed that the suspect arrived in a silver vehicle and parked alongside the fence of the pawn shop. The male said the wallet contained \$280, a social security card, TX ID card, Texas State ID, three gift cards and a bank card, for a total value of \$506.00.

The driver and the front seat passenger were charged for the drugs. The other three occupants were released at the scene. The driver and passenger were taken to jail and the vehicle was impounded.
