Offense: Theft

Location: 15300 blk San Pedro

An officer received a call on the city cell phone from the owner of an auto repair. He wanted to make a theft report. The officer went to the location and contacted the owner. He reported that a male walked up to the southwest corner of the property and cut the wires to a surveillance camera and removed it. The camera is used to protect his property and was attached to an eight foot pole. The individual climbed the chain link fence to be able to reach and remove the camera. The owner did not give anyone permission to remove the camera. The value of the camera is around \$300. The owner said he would provide police with video footage.

Location: 400 blk Winding Way

An officer was directed to the 400 block of Winding Way for a disabled vehicle. The officer arrived and observed a male subject and two females standing next to a white Volkswagen. The car had a flat passenger front tire and was up on a jack. The male was working on changing the tire. The officer spoke briefly with the female. She said she and her daughter had been driving west onto West Bitters when they struck a pot hole under the overpass. This caused the tire to go flat. She then called her husband who quickly arrived in another vehicle to help change her tire.

After just a few minutes the husband was able to change the tire without incident. The individuals were able to get back on the road and continue home.

Offense: Driving While Intoxicated/Possession of a Controlled Substance

Location: 200 blk West Bitters Road

An officer was traveling westbound in the 300 Blk of W. Bitters Rd. He observed a vehicle driving eastbound at a high rate of speed. The officer clocked (using vehicle radar) the vehicle going 51mph in a clearly marked 40mph zone. The officer turned around and stopped the vehicle. The vehicle came to a complete stop in the 200 Blk. of W. Bitters Rd. in a gas station parking lot. The officer made contact with the male driver and female passenger. As the officer made contact with the driver, he detected a strong odor of alcohol coming from inside the vehicle. The officer informed the driver why he had been stopped. The officer asked him if he had had any alcoholic beverages. The male informed the officer that he and his wife were coming from a bar and that his wife was drunk and vomiting on herself. The officer observed the female with vomit on her shirt and on the car door. The officer noticed that driver had glassy eyes and slurred speech. The officer asked the driver how much has he had to drink and he informed the officer that he has had a few. The officer had the male exit the vehicle and walk to the back of the car. The male was swaying back and forth while walking and standing. The officer asked the male again how much he had had to drink. The male said he a few beers and a few shots. The officer asked the driver if he would submit to a Standardized Field Sobriety Test to which he consented. He failed the test, was arrested and placed into the patrol car. As the officer was talking to the female, he noticed a bag with white powder in it. The bag was in plain sight. The driver admitted the drugs were his. It later tested positive for cocaine. The female had a friend come and pick her up. A breath test of the driver showed to be twice the legal limit. The driver was booked for the Cocaine and Driving While Intoxicated.
