## **Calls of Interest**

### **Offense: Suspicious Vehicle**

**Date: 07.05.17**

**Time: 0305 hours**

**Location: 14200 blk. San Pedro**

On 07.05.17 at approximately 0305 hrs, an officer was conducting a security check at a local business located in the 14200 block of San Pedro. The officer observed a vehicle parked in front of the business with the parking lights on. The officer attempted to make contact with the driver, but the driver was asleep in the vehicle. A cover officer arrived at which time the driver was woken up. The driver stated that they felt tired and decided to pull into the parking lot to sleep. Officers did not detect any odor or signs of alcohol from the driver. The driver's license was checked on the CAD system, which showed a current and active driver's license and no warrant's. The driver's vehicle was also checked and showed clear.

### **Offense: Theft**

On 07.05.17 at 0732 hrs, an officer was dispatched to the 500 block of Ventura Drive in Hollywood Park, to assist Hollywood Park Police on a stolen trailer call. While the officer was responding, a resident flagged down the officer and stated they were the owner of the stolen trailer. The resident, who lives in the 400 block of Tower Drive, told the officer that while they

were returning from walking their dog, they observed a white truck backed up to taking their trailer. The resident went inside to get the car keys and proceeded to follow the vehicle into Hollywood Park. The trailer was not secured to the truck properly and subsequently disconnected from the truck in the 500 block of Ventura Drive. Officers searched for the suspect truck, but were unable to locate it. The trailer was processed for latent prints and photographed. Upon completion, the trailer was returned to the owner.

**Offense: Burglary of Vehicle**

On 07.05.17 an officer was dispatched to a Burglary of a Vehicle, which occurred in the 15600 block of San Pedro. Upon the officer's arrival, contact was made with the victim. The victim informed the officer that they had went into a local business for five minutes. While inside the store, an unknown person entered their vehicle and stole an iPhone, Prescription pills, and some cigarettes. The victim remembers locking the vehicle before entering the store, but said the key FOB that locks the vehicle sometimes malfunctions. After inspecting the vehicle, no damage or signs of forced entry were discovered.

**Offense: Narcotic Possession/ Wanted Person**

An officer stopped a vehicle for multiple traffic violations in the 500 block of Tomahawk Trail. The driver was identified by their driver's license. The officer returned to the patrol unit and conducted a computer check on the driver. The computer return showed the driver had an active warrant for their arrest. The officer returned to the driver and placed him under arrest. The driver was secure in the patrol unit while an inventory of the vehicles contents was conducted. While the officer was conducting this inventory, a glass container with a green leafy substance was observed lying on the front passenger floor board. A field tested was administered which revealed a positive result for marijuana. The driver was taken to the Magistrate's office where they were booked on the outstanding warrant and possession of marijuana.
