Calls of Interest

Offense: Criminal Trespassing/ Narcotic Possession

Date: 07.23.17

Time: 1805 hours

Location: 100 blk. Aspen Lane

Officers' received a phone call from a resident, who stated that an individual was seen at a vacant residence in the 100 block of Aspen Lane. The resident believed this individual did not belong at the vacant house. Officers' responded to the location and made contact with the resident, who stated they tried to speak to the individual at the vacant house, but the individual went inside the house and came out with a black baseball bat. The resident felt unsafe and called the Police. The officers' walked over to the vacant house and made contact with the individual. The individual admitted that they did not own the property and had entered the property without the owner's permission. The individual stated they found the back door unlocked and entered the property. The individual was detained and placed in the back of a patrol vehicle. When asked if there was anyone else inside the house, the individual stated there was another person inside the master bedroom, which was located in the back of the house. Officers' announced their presence at the front door and entered the property. The house was checked, but no other people were found inside. The detained individual's clothes and garbage were all over the floor of the master bedroom. Officers' also discovered a plastic macaroni carton sitting in middle of the bedroom floor. This carton contained a small plastic zip baggie with a small amount of a crystal like substance in it. The substance was collected as evidence and taken to the Hill Country Village Police Department where it was weighed and tested. The 0.2 Grams of the crystal substance tested positive for the presence of Methamphetamines. Officers' also discovered a small plastic container next to the macaroni carton that had a small amount of a green leafy substance inside that weighed 2.3 Grams. It also tested positive for the presence of a cannabinoid substance (marijuana). Both the methamphetamine and marijuana were secured in the property room. The individual was arrested and booked.

Offense: Violation State Vehicle Laws

Location: 13800 blk. San Pedro Ave.

An officer was conducting Radar Traffic in the 13800 blk. San Pedro when a vehicle was observed displaying an expired vehicle registration sticker. The officer activated the emergency lights of the patrol unit and conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. The officer informed the driver why they were stopped, due to the expired vehicle registration, and asked for their Driver's License and Insurance. The driver provided a license, but stated they did not have Insurance for the vehicle. A computer check through NCIC/TCIC verified no insurance on the vehicle. The driver was informed that they would be receiving two citations and the vehicle would be towed due to no insurance. Texas Towing was requested to the location pick up and store the vehicle. The driver was issued their citations and departed with no further incident.

Offense: Burglary of Building

Location: 200 blk. Village Circle

A resident called in to the Police Department to report that their garage was burglarized and tools were taken over night. An officer arrived at location and made contact with the resident and their child, who had discovered the items were missing. When the officer arrived, it was noticed that several houses in the area are under construction. Several construction workers were observed walking freely on property and inside the house while working. The resident informed the officer that their child had been working in the garage the night before. When the child left the garage, it was unsecured with one door open and the other off the hinges. Upon the child's return the next morning, it was discovered that items were moved around and tools were missing. After checking the area the resident also discovered that the back door to the inside of the home had been opened and items that were in front of the door had been moved. Items missing included: A Makkita hammer/impact combo kit, Dewalt sander, Husqvarna gas chainsaw, and an Echo gas trimmer with a collective value of over \$800. Eleven (11) color photos were taken, two (2) Latent Prints were lifted and a Makitta pamphlet was taken from the area and forwarded to HCV CID. The resident was given a HCV Intent to Prosecute, Victim Information, and a Property Loss form to fill out. The resident was provided a card with the case number for the incident.
