Offense: Evading Arrest

Date: 08.09.2017

Time: 0858 hours

Location: 13800 blk San Pedro

An officer was parked southbound in the 13800 block of San Pedro Ave. when a vehicle was clocked exceeding the posted speed limit. As the officer was waiting for vehicles to pass to conduct a traffic stop on that vehicle, a different vehicle drove by me at a high rate of speed.

The officer turned onto San Pedro Ave. and followed the second vehicle southbound to the 100 Blk. W. Bitters Rd. The vehicle got into the far right lane as to turn West onto W. Bitters. The vehicle came up the yield sign then took a left onto W. Bitters traveling eastbound in the westbound lane. The officer activated the patrol vehicles emergency lights and siren and tried to conduct a traffic stop. While traveling into oncoming traffic the vehicle then turned right and traveled southbound on San Pedro. The vehicle picked up speed and began extending distance from the officer. Dispatch was notified of the driver refusing to stop. The vehicle continued southbound on San Pedro Ave, where the officer lost sight of it around San Pedro Ave. and Rhapsody Dr. Officers' searched the area for the vehicle, but could not locate it. Dash cam video of the vehicle will be reviewed and forwarded to CID for investigation.

Offense: Possession of Drug Paraphernalia

Location: 500 blk West Bitters Rd.

An officer stopped a vehicle for traveling 54mph in a clearly marked 40mph zone. While contacting the driver, the officer detected a strong odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. The officer asked the driver about the odor, at which time the driver informed the officer that there was a pipe used to smoke marijuana in the center console. The driver also stated that

their might be a little marijuana in the vehicle. At this time, the driver was removed from the vehicle and detained for further investigation. An additional officer arrived as cover officer and maintained visual contact of the driver throughout the stop. A search was conducted inside the vehicle, which revealed a multicolored glass pipe with burnt Marijuana residue. A metal grinder with Marijuana residue was also discovered. After the search was completed, the driver was released with two Municipal Court Summons for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and Violation of Posted Speed Limit.

An officer was dispatched to the 14000 block of San Pedro for a report of graffiti. Upon arrival, contact was made with the complainant, who stated a large amount of graffiti was discovered on a fence surrounding the location. The complainant estimated it would cost \$500 to clean up the property. While at the location, a neighboring business owner approached the officer. The business owner related a customer's vehicle left in front of his business overnight, had suffered the same graffiti as what was on the fence. It is believed the Graffiti occurred between 11:30 P.M and 6:00A.M. This business owner also related that he noticed an individual at the neighboring business taking pictures of the graffiti. When approached, this the subject got into a car and departed the location.
