Offense: Disturbance

Location: 15800 blk. San Pedro

Officers' were dispatched to a local restaurant in the 15800 block of San Pedro Avenue for a disturbance in progress. According to dispatch, there were several individuals arguing with management and refusing to pay their bill for service. Upon arrival, a Hollywood Park Police Officer was on scene talking with the individuals. The individuals were identified, at which time it was determined that most of the individuals were related to each other, and they had been consuming alcoholic beverages. An officer contacted the complainant who stated that the intoxicated individuals were using vulgar language inside the restaurant. The individuals were asked to stop cursing due to kids being around. At this point, one of the intoxicated individuals stood up and began to argue. A verbal argument ensued before the intoxicated individuals departed the patio area. The intoxicated individuals went inside and began to argue with the restaurant management. Officers' had the intoxicated individuals walk outside the restaurant, at which the manager advised that one of the individuals had not paid their tab. Officers' made contact with that individual in the parking lot and had the individual return to the restaurant and pay the bill. The other members of the group remained outside the restaurant waiting for a ride due to their consumption of alcohol. After officers' contacted the manager to ensure everything was in order at the restaurant, officers' went outside to check on the intoxicated individuals. After walking outside, officers' heard noise and yelling coming from behind the restaurant. Officers' checked the noise, at which time they discovered one of the intoxicated individuals was on the ground with blood coming from their head. One of the intoxicated individuals were detained while the injured party was checked on. Emergency Medical Services were called to check on the injured individual. EMS determined that the injured party did not need to be transported to the hospital, so they departed the scene. The intoxicated individuals all agreed that the injury was sustained through mutual combat among themselves. Neither of the involved individuals desired to pursue charges against the other. Shortly after, they departed the restaurant with sober drivers.

A resident entered City Hall to file a report for possible identity theft. The resident related that they received a notification in the mail from the United States Postal Service (USPS) notifying them of a Change of Address Order that had been submitted for their residence. The purpose of the notification was to obtain confirmation for the change. The resident stated that they made contact with the local Post Office branch to advise that they did not submit or give consent for anyone to submit, a change of address in their name. The individual at the Post Office checked the submission order and was able to provide limited information to the resident. The resident further related that the address that person(s) unknown wanted to have mail sent to, was an address in Ohio. The resident advised they were unfamiliar with this address. Post Office personnel were able to cancel the change of address and resume normal delivery service. The resident was put in contact with the Postal Inspector who advised that the situation would be investigated and further advised the resident to file a report with the local police department. Due to this incident, the resident decided to check their credit report through all three major credit bureaus. The resident discovered that person(s) unknown had attempted to open several credit card accounts in their name as well as their business name. The report was forwarded to CID for further investigation.
