### **Offense: Credit Card Abuse**

### **Offense: Possession of Controlled Substance**

While at the Hill Country Village City Office, an officer received a phone requesting an officer to a local business. The caller stated that there was an individual sitting in a car outside the business. According to the caller, the individual appeared to need some kind of medical attention. The caller stated that they believed the individual had passed out from narcotic use. Officers' arrived and made contact with the car and driver. The passed out individual was seen in the driver seat. As an officer looked in the window, the bottom end of a glass smoking pipe could be seen in plain view. The officer knocked on the window and was able to get the driver to wake up and open the door. Upon opening of the door, the officer observed a second glass smoking pipe in the door pocket. The driver was sweating profusely and their eyes were tightly constricted. The driver was disoriented and was unsure of where they were or how they had gotten to the business. The driver's id was obtained and computer check showed several

outstanding warrants for the driver's arrest. Due to the driver's appearance, the officer asked if he had used and narcotics. The driver admitted to using narcotics and informed the officer where the narcotics were at inside the vehicle. Inside the driver's pouch was what appeared to be Methamphetamine and Marijuana. The narcotics and paraphernalia were seized and turned into the property room. The driver was taken into custody for possession of controlled substance PG1 and possession of marijuana. The driver was arrested and booked into the Magistrate's Office.

Officers' were dispatched to the listed location by BCSO for a suspicious noise call. On arrival, officers' were met at the front of the property by the homeowner who said they heard a loud noise and feared someone was attempting to break into their house. Officers' checked the perimeter of the residence. While doing so an unlocked door was found to the guest house at the rear of the property. At that point officers' cleared the guest house. No one was found inside. An unlocked door was found leading into the garage of the main residence. This area was checked, no signs of disturbance or anyone inside. All other doors and windows were secure and no signs of an attempted forced entry could be found. The resident was advised of the unlocked doors and told to call us back if they heard anything else.
