Offense: Criminal Mischief \$100 < \$750

An officer was dispatched for a Criminal Mischief report that occurred in the 14700 block of San Pedro. An employee of a local business arrived for work and observed a broken window in the back door of the business. The employee immediately called HCV City Hall for Police assistance. The employee stated that they did not see any other vehicles in the parking lot and did not see any suspicious person(s) on the premises. The employee unlocked the door and the officer searched the entire building for any other damaged property. The other suites were locked and all appeared to be in order. The rear door to the building did not show any signs of forced entry. The owner of the building was contacted and advised of the damaged window. The owner stated they did not know who could have done the damage. The officer processed the scene for any possible latent prints, however, no latent prints were discovered. The scene was photographed for future reference. This case was forwarded to the Investigations unit for follow up.

Offense: Burglary of Building

Officers' were dispatched to local business in the 15700 block of San Pedro for a Burglary report. Upon officers' arrival, contact was made with the assistant manager, who unknown

person(s) had thrown a large boulder through a back window of the business. The unknown person(s) then proceeded to crawl through the window and take several car batteries without the effective consent of the business. The officers' were able to retrieve video footage from the store manager which revealed a suspect vehicle and video of the suspect's stealing the batteries. The manager estimated the loss value was around \$2,000. The report, photos, video, and an inventory list were forwarded to the Investigations unit for follow up.

The manager of a local business in the 15600 block of San Pedro called for a police report regarding a theft that had occurred over night. According to the manager, a suspect had driven their car through an alleyway adjacent to this business. The suspect then exited their vehicle, approach the back side of the business and proceed to steal a pressure washer, hose, and other attachments to the pressure washer. The officer was able to retrieve that surveillance video from the business. The officer observed property the suspect had left behind and secured it as evidence. The officer also lifted one latent print. This case will be forwarded to the Investigations unit for follow up.

An officer observed a subject walk up to, open, and remove mail from a mailbox of a residence in the 100 block of South Tower Drive. The officer responded and contacted the subject. While the officer began to open the backpack, the subject stated they were about to be in trouble because they had taken mail from several different locations in the city. The officer removed several pieces of mail belonging to four different residents of Hill Country Village. The subject was arrested and booked at the Magistrates. The mail and backpack were secure as evidence. This case will be forwarded to the Investigations unit for follow up.
