## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Assist the Public**

**Date: 09.25.17**

**Time: 2245 hours**

**Location: 16300 Blk. San Pedro**

On September 25, 2017 at 2245 hours, an officer assisted with a vehicle that ran out of gas. The officer gave the motorist a courtesy ride to a local gas station in the area. The motorist was able to purchase fuel and a gas container and fuel their vehicle.

On September 27, 2017 at 1646 hours, an officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle that ran the red light at Brook Hollow Boulevard and San Pedro Avenue. As the officer followed the vehicle, the officer observed the vehicle fail to signal for a lane change. The officer activated the overhead emergency lights to signal the driver to stop. The vehicle pulled into a parking lot in the 14600 block of San Pedro Avenue. The officer made contact with the driver, who at the time, did not have a valid driver's license. The officer conducted a computer check on the driver's name and date of birth. The return showed the driver had six San Antonio Municipal Warrants. The officer called the San Antonio Magistrates Office and verified the warrants were still active. Upon confirmation, the driver was placed under arrest for the warrants. The passenger of the vehicle gathered their belongings and called for a ride. As a result of the arrest, the vehicle was impounded. The driver was transported to the San Antonio Magistrates Office for booking. While completing the process at the Magistrates office, a second computer check revealed the driver had five additional warrants that were previously unknown. The driver was booked on all eleven warrants.

Officers' were dispatched to a local business in the 15700 block of San Pedro Avenue for a suspicious person call. According to dispatch, here was an individual looking into the windows of parked vehicles at this business. Officers' responded to the location. Upon arrival, an officer went inside the business and made contact with the manager, who stated that there was a truck outside with an individual detailing a vehicle. The manager continued stating that the individual doing the detailing was looking into windows of vehicles parked outside and the manager was concerned. Officers' made contact with the individual who was detailing the vehicle, who stated that it was their detailing business. This individual stated that someone from the gym called and requested the detailing service. A computer check was conducted on the individual, which returned no wants or warrants. Officers' contacted the owner of the vehicle being detailed, who confirmed he called that company to detail his vehicle.

On the listed date and time, an officer observed the scene of a motor vehicle accident that occurred at the intersection of San Pedro Ave. and Bitters Rd. This officer had the drivers move their respective vehicles out of the intersection and into a parking lot nearby. Insurance, driver's license and vehicle information was gathered by this officer. While collecting information, a witness stated to this officer that it appeared the driver of Unit 1 attempted to run a red light at the intersection and Unit 2 collided with Unit 1 at low speed. After observation of the damages, this witness account appeared to be true. Vehicle damage did not appear to exceed \$1000. The vehicles were able to be driven away from the scene and no injuries were apparent or reported at the scene.
