## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Suspicious Vehicle**

**Date: 10.02.17**

**Time: 0430 hours**

**Location: 14000 Blk. San Pedro**

On October 2, 2017 at 0430 hours, an officer observed a white Nissan Frontier parked next to the van belonging to a local church in the 14000 block of San Pedro Avenue. As the officer pulled into the parking lot, an individual got into the white Nissan Frontier and drove onto San Pedro Avenue. The officer followed the vehicle and conducted a traffic stop. The Frontier stopped at a business and the driver immediately exited the vehicle and questioned why they were stopped. The officer informed the driver that they were being stopped for their suspicious behavior at the church. A second officer returned to the church and verified the van was secure and undamaged. The driver of the Frontier told the first officer the reason they were parked next to the van was to relieve themselves. A computer check on the driver revealed their license to drive was suspended. The officers' also observed the second letter in the license plate number had black tape placed on it to make a J look like a U. Photos were taken of the altered license plate and the black tape was removed to show the original letter. The driver was issued two citations for Driving While License Invalid and Displaying Wrong, Fictitious, Altered, or Obscured License Plate. The driver contacted a family member to make location with a valid driver's license to pick up the vehicle.

**Offense: Found Property**

**Location: 100 Blk. Aspen Lane**

On 10-03-2017 at 1315hrs, an individual walked into City Hall and turned in a pink/purple wallet. The front office staff received the wallet and stated that the individual said the wallet was found at a business location in the 15300 block of San Pedro. The driver's license inside the wallet was used to identify the owner of the wallet. The officer attempted to locate the owner by the business where the wallet was found. The owner of the wallet was still at the business, waiting for SAPD to make the report regarding the missing wallet. The wallet was returned and the owner stated nothing was missing from the wallet. No further action was taken.

An officer was dispatched to a local restaurant in the 15800 block of San Pedro for a disturbance. Upon the officer's arrival, a Hollywood Park Police Officer was observed at the location. This officer stated the actors involved in the disturbance had left the location prior to their arrival. Officers' made contact with the manager of the business, who said a couple who appeared to be intoxicated had become belligerent and argumentative with the staff using foul language and being verbally abusive. The manager offered to get the couple a ride home but they were offended by the offer and left the location. The manager was very worried about the couple driving and called for police to intervene. Officers' checked the area, but no vehicle matching the couples' description was found.

**Offense: Assist Other Agency**

**Time: 0231 hours**

**Location: 15300 Blk. San Pedro**

On October 6, 2017 at approximately 0230 hours, an officer encountered a disturbance occurring in the parking lot of a business located in the 15300 block of San Pedro. The officer observed approximately six individuals involved in a heated verbal argument as they stood around the parking lot. As the officer pulled into the parking lot and activated the red and blue emergency lights, the crowd began to disperse. One subject was apparently bleeding from the mouth but, refused to speak with the officer. A second subject appeared to have blood on them, but they were also reluctant to speak with the officer. A computer check of these subjects showed they were clear and free of any warrants. Since no victims came forward to make accusations, the subjects were advised they were free to go. A San Antonio Police Officer arrive at the location just as the subjects departed. They were advised of the incident and all officers returned to service.
