Calls of Interest

Offense: Wanted Person

Date: 10.17.17

Time: 1440 hours

Location: 300 blk. West Bitters Rd.

On listed time, date, and location an Officer observed a vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed in the 13800 blk. of San Pedro. The Officer clocked the vehicle (using Lidar) traveling 63 MPH in a clearly marked 45 MPH zone. The Officer followed the vehicle and initiated a traffic stop at the intersection of W. Bitters Rd. and Wood Valley. The Officer made contact with the driver and informed them why they were stopped. The Officer requested the driver's License and insurance. A computer check showed the driver had an active warrant out of Bexar County. The Officer contacted BCSO Dispatch to verify the warrant. Dispatch confirmed the BCSO Warrant as well as warrant issued from the City of San Antonio Municipal Court. Dispatch also informed the Officer there possible warrants issued from the JP3 court, but those warrants could not be verified. The driver also showed to have active warrants from the Hill Country Village Municipal Court. The Officer contacted the Hill Country Village Court and verified two active Warrants for the City of Hill Country Village. At this time, a second Officer arrived at location as cover officer. The driver was informed that they would be going to the Hill Country Village PD to reset their court date for the Warrants with Hill Country Village and then be taken the Magistrates Office for the Warrants with Bexar County and San Antonio.

Offense: Burglary of Vehicle

Time: 0853 hours

Location: 14100 blk. San Pedro

On October 19, 2017 at 0842 hours an Officer was contact by City hall to make contact with an individual regarding a Burglary to their company truck at a local business in the 14100 block of

San Pedro. The Officer arrived at location and made contact with the Complainant, who informed the Officer that the Vehicle Burglary Occurred on October 17, 2017 at approximately 2240 hours. The Complainant told the Officer that an unidentified person was seen on camera walking in the area. After the unidentified person walked the area for a few minutes they opened the door to listed vehicle (which was unlocked) and entered the vehicle. Camera footage shows the individual entering the vehicle at 2240 hours and departing from the vehicle at 2251 hours. The Complainant stated that they were not going to report it until talking with the insurance company, who advised to make a police report of the incident. The Complainant provided a 4GB USB Flash Drive, which contained the video footage of the incident. The Complainant informed the Officer that the vehicle was checked after the incident. Some small items were taken but nothing of significant value that the company just needed a report.

Offense: Disturbance - Noise

Date: 10.20.17

Time: 2139 hours

Location: 14000 blk. Mint Trail

An Officer received a call on the city cell phone in reference to a Disturbance (Noise) in the above listed area. The caller stated that the noise coming from the band playing at a residence was too loud and disturbing the caller's family. The caller related that they had called earlier and wanted to have something done to end the music. The caller believed the music was well over the 68 decibel noise level. The Officer responded to the area and drove to the end of the street. At that location, the music could barely be heard. The Officer registered the music with a decibel meter in the low 60's. The Officer responded to the address where the band was playing and registered the noise level at 69 on the decibel meter from the roadway in front of the residence. The Officer made contact with the homeowner who related that the band was finishing up their last two songs and then they would be shutting everything down. As the Officer spoke with the homeowner, several guests were already leaving. The Officer spoke with the band, who agreed to play their last song. No further action was necessary.

Offense: Wanted Person

Date: 10.19.17

Time: 1535 hours

Location: 13400 blk. San Pedro

An Officer observed listed vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed southbound in the 13800 Blk. of San Pedro Ave. The vehicle was clocked (using Lidar) traveling 60mph in a clearly marked 45mph zone. Once the vehicle passed, the Officer followed the vehicle to a location where the Officer believed it to be safe to conduct the traffic stop. The Officer made contact with the driver and informed them why they had been stopped. The Officer asked for Driver's License and Proof of Insurance. While the Officer was making contact with the Driver, the Officer detected the odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. The Driver was asked if there was any marijuana inside the vehicle, which they stated "no" but, admitted to using marijuana in the past. The Driver told the Officer that the Officer could search the vehicle. The Officer asked the Driver to step out of the vehicle and remained at the rear bumper of the vehicle. A computer check on the Driver showed an active Warrant out of Bexar County. The Officer verified the warrant was active with BCSO Dispatch. The Officer searched the vehicle for marijuana and none was found. The Driver was arrested and transported to the Magistrate for booking.
