Offense: Welfare Check

Date: 10.23.17

Time: 0220 hours

Location: 15300 Blk. San Pedro

While conducting a business patrol, an Officer observed an individual lying on the sidewalk close to a building. The Officer contacted the individual to ensure they were ok. The individual appeared to be homeless and was just sleeping. After ensuring they were not in need of medical assistance, the individual decided to depart the location. No further action taken.

Officers were dispatched to the listed location for an EMS call. Upon arrival, contact was made with the homeowner and the care taker. The homeowner believed they were having a stroke. San Antonio Fire Department and EMS made the location and began assessing the homeowner's condition. The determination was made by EMS that the homeowner needed to be transported to the nearest emergency room.

Offense: Possession of Drug Paraphernalia

Location: 300 Blk. West Bitters Road

A vehicle was seeding in the 13800 block of San Pedro. The officer was able to stop the vehicle in the 300 block of West Bitters Road, where contact with the driver was made. While talking to the driver, the Officer detected the strong odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. The Officer asked the driver if they smoked marijuana or if there was any inside the vehicle. The driver informed the Officer that there was no marijuana inside the vehicle, but they did have a "Bong" wedged between the seats. The Officer asked for the driver to exit the vehicle. The Officer returned to the patrol unit and ran a computer check on the driver. Upon completion of the computer check, the Officer returned to the violator's vehicle and conducted a vehicle search for illegal narcotics. This search resulted in a Multicolored Rubber Smoking Device "Bong", as well as a Multicolored Metal Grinder, and a Multicolored Glass Smoking Pipe. The Officer also discovered a Pink in Color Glass Smoking Pipe in the back seat of the vehicle. All of the above collected items had burnt marijuana residue in them. The driver was issued two (2) Hill Country Village Municipal Court Summons for Violation of Posted Speed Limit and Possession of Narcotic Paraphernalia.

Offense: Driving While Intoxicated

Date: 10.28.17

Time: 0353 hours

Location: San Pedro Ave. @ Winding Way

At approximately 03:53 hours, an Officer approached the intersection listed above and noticed the traffic signal was green. There was a vehicle at the traffic light, which did not move as the light turned green. After a few seconds, the Officer activated the overhead emergency lights to see if the driver would react, which they did not. At this time, the Officer exited the patrol unit and approached the driver side door. Inside the car was a subject slumped over in the driver's seat. The vehicle was running and appeared to be in gear. The Officer knocked on the window, which woke the driver. As the driver woke up, they looked up at the Officer and began to roll away. The vehicle rolled straight into the side walk and came to a sudden stop. The Officer exited the patrol unit and approached the driver door again. The driver was not injured and exited the vehicle. As the driver door opened, the Officer immediately smelled the odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from the driver's breath. The driver appeared unbalanced and unsteady on their feet. The Officer suspected the driver was under the influence of alcohol. The Officer asked the driver for their driver's license. The driver produced a Mexican driver's license. The Officer advised Bexar County dispatch of the situation and requested an additional unit for cover. While waiting for the cover officer, a San Antonio Police Department officer arrived on scene. This Officer stated they had received complaints on the vehicle for not proceeding through the intersection. This Officer waited at the location until a second Hill Country Village Officer arrived. Upon arrival of the cover unit, Officer's started administering the Standard Field Sobriety Testing. The driver was asked to submit to a few tests to determine their ability to operate a motor vehicle. The driver immediately refused to take any test and indicated they would not submit to taking a breath test. Based upon the Officer's training,

knowledge and experience, it was determined that the driver was intoxicated and unable to safely operate a motor vehicle. The driver displayed slurred speech, a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath and an inability to maintain their balance. As a result, the driver was placed under arrest for Driving While Intoxicated. The Officer transported the driver to the Magistrates office where a warrant to for a blood draw was completed. Upon completion, the driver's blood was drawn by staff at the Magistrates office. No further action was taken at this time.
