Incident: Burglary of a Vehicle

Location: 15301 San Pedro Ave (Christian Brothers Automotive)

Details: Hill Country Village officer was dispatched to the location for two vehicles that were burglarized overnight. HCV officer gathered all necessary evidence and contacted the owners of the vehicles. The case was forwarded to the Hill Country Village Criminal Investigation Sergeant.

Incident: Alarm

Details: Hill Country Village officer received a call for service for a vehicle alarm going off. Upon arrival Hill Country Village officer made contact with the resident. The resident advised the officer that she was worried because the alarm was going off and wanted us to check the vehicle. Hill Country officers checked the vehicle and found no signs of criminal activity. Hill Country officer did find an open sunroof and advised the resident. No criminal activity found.

Details: HCV officer was dispatched to the location for a disturbance in progress. HCV officer made location and spoke to the employee. The employee stated that a customer had called earlier in the day asking for specific auto parts. The employee stated later that day a black male individual walked in and asked for the parts he called about. The employee stated she brought the parts out and left them on the counter. The employee stated when she left to go to check for another part for the individual he left the store taking the product. The employee stated she confronted the subject and asked for the parts. The employee stated she found the parts in a bush near the store. HCV is conducting patrol by's of the business.

Details: HCV officer was conducting a patrol by of a residence that was broken into earlier in the month. While conducting a patrol by, HCV officer observed a sliding glass door ajar that wasn't normally open. Due to the condition of the residence the HCV officer was not able to determine if anything was taken. HCV officer made contact with the resident and advised him of what he found. The case was forwarded to HCV Criminal Investigations Department.

Details: HCV officers were dispatched to 112 Aspen Ln for a burglary in progress. Upon arrival HCV officers observed a vehicle parked in the driveway. Officers ran the license plate, the parked vehicle came back stolen. Officers then searched the residence, upon searching the residence, HCV officers found two suspects hiding in the residence, one of the suspects was armed and had a warrant. Details: HCV officer was dispatched to 15231 San Pedro Avenue for a vehicle that was on fire. SAFD arrived on scene and was able to extinguish the fire. After getting surveillance video from the local businesses a suspect was seen throwing something on the vehicle and moments later the vehicle caught fire. The case has been forwarded to the HCV Criminal Investigations department.
