Calls of Interest

Incident: Animal Call-Deer

Date: 01/04/2026

Time: 9:12am

Location: 409 Winding Way

Details: Hill Country Village officer was dispatched to the location for a deer that tried jumping over a fence and injured its back legs preventing it from walking. Due to the deer being unable to walk, the HCV officer had to dispatch the animal. Bexar County waste management was called to pick up the carcass.

Incident: Disturbance

Date: 01/09/2026

Time: 9:02pm

Location: 15801 San Pedro Ave. (Willies Grill and Ice House)

Details: While patrolling the area, a Hill Country Village officer observed a male subject waving his arms and yelling "police". The HCV officer made location. The subject stated "he was attacked while waiting to pick up his food at the restaurant." The male subject stated "the person who attacked him went inside the restaurant." The HCV officer made contact with the other individual and asked him what occurred. The other subject stated "they got in a disagreement over a parking spot." Both parties were advised that the report was going to be labeled a disturbance. Both parties agreed to the report and departed the location without further incident.

Details: A HCV officer was contacted on the Hill Country Village patrol phone and notified of a burglary of a habitation that occurred. The resident stated he was unsure if the male subject removed any property from his home. The case was forwarded to the HCV Criminal Investigations Department.

Details: A HCV officer was dispatched to 215 Winding Way for a report of a burglary of a vehicle. The resident stated that his credit card had been used without his consent at Target. The case is forwarded to the HCV Criminal Investigations Department.

Details: HCV officer was dispatched to the location for a burglary of a vehicle. The passenger stated the driver was driving to fast and felt the golf cart on two wheels before it flipped over on its side. EMS was not needed. The HCV officer generated a crash report.

Details: HCV officers were dispatched to 112 Aspen Ln for a burglary of a habitation. The resident stated an unknown individual cut a bike lock that was used to secure the front door to the residence. The resident stated the unknown subject made entry inside the residence and rummaged through his personal belongings. The resident was not sure if anything was taken at the time of the report. The case is forwarded to the HCV Criminal Investigations Department.
