Incident: 911 Hang up

Date: 02/01/2026

Time: 12:49am

Location: 15083 San Pedro Ave (Iron Ridge Apartments)

Details: Hill Country Village officer was dispatched to the Iron Ridge Apartments for a 911 hang up. Upon arrival HCV officer made contact with the resident who stated her 6 year old son called 911 on accident. The resident called her son to see who comes when you dial 911, the HCV officer advised the boy to only call in case of an emergency. The HCV officer gave the boy a HCV police badge sticker and left location.

Incident: DWI/PI

Details: While conducting a traffic stop HCV officer observed a truck with a male driver in the driver's seat that appeared to be asleep at the gas pump. After completing the traffic stop HCV officer stood by to see if the subject would wake up. The subject did not wake up and the HCV officer conducted a welfare check on the male subject. After knocking multiple times the male subject woke up and opened the door. The HCV officer smelled a strong odor of alcohol coming from the driver. After conducting a field sobriety test it was determined the subject was under the influence of alcohol and arrested for DWI.
