### **Calls of Interest**

**Incident: Civil Matter**

**Date: 03/02/2026**

**Time: 10:14am**

**Location: 13815 San Pedro Ave (EZ Pawn)**

**Details:** Hill Country Village officer was dispatched to EZ Pawn for a report of angry customer. Upon arrival the HCV officer spoke with the angry customer who stated he purchased a video game controller that did not work and wanted a refund. The employee stated she would only refund up to \$10. The customer did not like that and stated he was just going to leave. No further action taken.

**Incident: Sick/Injured Person**

**Details:** HCV officers were dispatched to the location for a report of male subject falling down and bleeding. Upon arrival HCV officers observed the male subject on the floor not breathing. At that time, HCV officers began life saving measures and performed CPR until San Antonio Fire Department (SAFD) arrived on scene and took over. SAFD transported the male subject to University Hospital for further evaluations.

**Details:** A HCV officer was dispatched to location for a 911 hang up. Upon arrival HCV officer spoke to the resident who stated he accidentally dialed 911 while doing yard work. No criminal activity was observed.

**Incident: Burglary of a Building**

**Location: 100 Tomahawk Trail**

**Details:** HCV officers were dispatched to 100 Tomahawk Trail for a report an unknown male subject on the property. A HCV officer spoke to the housekeeper on the city cell phone. The housekeeper stated "she observed an unknown male going in and out of the residence and removing items from the residence." HCV officers arrived on scene and observed the male subject still on property. HCV officers attempted to speak with the subject but he would not talk. HCV officer observed a dark object in the subjects hand, the HCV officer drew his service weapon and asked to the subject to show his hands and lay on the ground. The subject complied and was detained. HCV officers made contact with the homeowner who stated "the subject was not allowed to be on the property and was not given consent to remove those items." The subject was then taken into custody and transported to Bexar County Jail.

**Incident: Theft (Exploitation of Elderly)**

**Details:** HCV officer was contacted via the city cell phone by a resident claiming that she had been scammed and the suspect that scammed her has been to her residence. The resident stated she received a call from an individual claiming to work for a bank the resident banks with. The individual stated \$1400 dollars was taken from her account. The individual advised the resident that for \$25000 the bank could assist with an internal investigation. The resident did what the individual asked and was able to get \$25000 in cash to the individual. After the money was given to the individual the resident realized she had been scammed and contacted HCV police department. This case has been forwarded to the HCV Criminal Investigations Department.

**Incident: Motor Vehicle Accident**

**Location: 100 Block Antelope**

**Details:** HCV officer was dispatched to the location for a motor vehicle accident. Upon arrival San Antonio Fire Department was already on location attending to an elderly female. While SAFD was attempting to extract the driver from the vehicle, the driver passed out. Paramedics placed the driver on the stretcher and transported her to a local hospital to be further assessed. While conducting an investigation it appeared that the driver suffered a medical episode while driving which caused the accident.
