Calls of Interest

Incident: Forgery

Date: 04/01/2026

Time: 4:10pm

Location: 13647 Treasure Trail

Details: Hill Country Village officer received a call for forgery at location. The resident advised the HCV officer that an unknown individual forged a check for \$3750. The resident stated that she wished to press charges against the unknown individual. The information was given to HCV Criminal Investigations Department for further investigation.

Incident: Damaged Property

Location: 15667 San Pedro Avenue (SPS Designs)

Details: Hill Country Village officer received a call for damaged property at location. Upon arrival the HCV officer made contact with an employee who stated that when he arrived to work he noticed a broken window. The employee stated that he also noticed a trail of blood inside the office. The employee followed the trail and found a severely injured deer. The deer appeared to run through the window breaking it and getting severely injured in the process. There were no signs of criminal activity.

Incident: Indecency with a child

Details: A HCV officer was dispatched to the location for a call for indecency with a child. Upon arrival the HCV officer made contact with the child's father. The father advised that while he and his wife were looking at jewelry a male subject sat down next to their daughter and showed her a sexually explicit video of a male individual. The child then advised her parents of what happened and when they went to confront the male subject he was nowhere to be found. HCV officers were able to obtain the male subject's information from a store employee. The case was forwarded to HCV Criminal Investigations Department for further investigation. With the information obtained by HCV officers an arrest was made and the male subject is currently in jail. Great job officers!!!

Incident: DWI

Details: While conducting a traffic stop, HCV officer pulled over a driver that was speeding (60mph in a 40mph zone). While speaking with the driver the HCV officer smelled the odor of alcohol coming from inside the vehicle. The driver also had bloodshot eyes. The HCV officer then conducted a Standardized Field Sobriety test on the driver. The driver failed the test and placed under arrest for driving while intoxicated.

Details: HCV officer was advised to make the location of 106 Powderhorn for a report of an Amazon truck that was stuck. Upon the officers' arrival, the officer observed that the truck appeared to be stuck in wet mud directly next to the sprinkler system. The HCV officer obtained all parties information for insurance purposes.

Details: While patrolling a HCV officer observed a vehicle with his hazards lights on. The HCV officer parked his patrol unit behind the disabled vehicle and asked if the driver if they needed assistance. The HCV officer was able to assist the driver and safely push the vehicle to a nearby gas station.

Details: A HCV officer received a call on the city cell phone about an unknown individual on his property. The resident advised the HCV officer that no one was allowed to be in or on his property. Upon arrival HCV officers observed a male subject walking from the rear of the property behind the garage. The officers immediately detained the male subject and placed him

in the back of the patrol unit. The officers then conducted an investigation. During the investigation the HCV officers found evidence which led the officers to believe that the male subject was squatting inside the home for an unknown amount of time. The officer then took the subject back to the police department for processing and transported him to jail.
